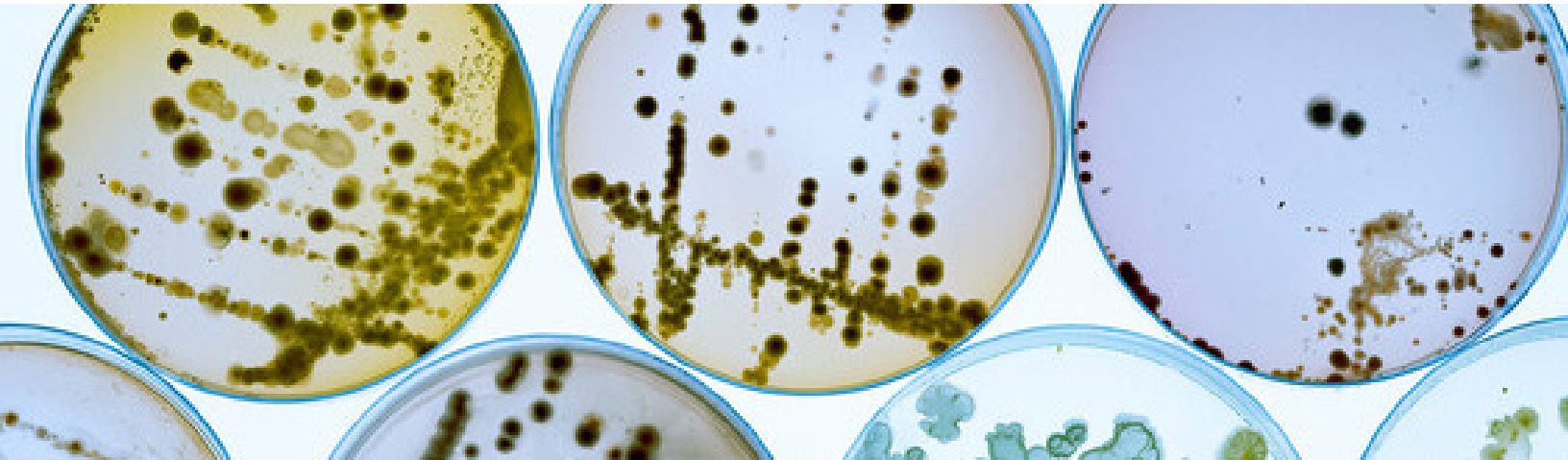


Presumptive results. What are they, and why don't they always confirm?

In this webinar we look at the different aspects of the detection and confirmation stages in most routine microbiological methods. We define what is meant by a presumptive result, and explain why it is perfectly acceptable for the laboratory to report some results as presumptive, whilst other tests require full confirmation techniques to be carried out.

We also explore what exactly is happening when the initial presumptive pathogen result doesn't confirm as the target organism, and explain how this is a natural consequence of the selectivity requirements of the test.
